We are very excited here at Liwara to be offering our Year 2 and Year 4 classes URStrong's new Friendology 101 curriculum starting next term.

Some of you might already be aware of the great support provided through URStrong in programs such as Girl Power and Good Guys, the brainchild of Dana Kerford and spreading through Australia, with a high profile already in many of our schools, including Perth College.

John Greenhill, one of our Year 2 teachers and myself were fortunate to go to the Friendology 101 Summit here in Perth last Friday 31st March for a day of learning all about the curriculum and how to facilitate it best here at Liwara. Therefore, equipped with lots of great ideas to support our students in their interactions and friendships, we are pleased to be offering it as part of our Health and Wellbeing curriculum!

Term 1 has seen our school community continuing to focus on Reducing, Re-using and Recycling. This was re-enforced by a series of incursions conducted by the Keep Australia Beautiful council. Each year level attended 2 sessions which were engaging and informative for all children

To continue this foci and healthy eating, beginning next term in week 3 and until the end of term, all year levels will be examining what's inside their lunch box and asking 'Is it wrapper free?'. Items with wrappers will be counted and tallied each week with the aim of reducing wrapped food items where possible.

Just before the end of the year, results will be compared and the class with the least wrappers for the year will be declared the winners!





2017 marks the beginning of a pilot program, at Liwara catholic Primary School. The year 2 classes have been chosen as the inaugural classes. Signora Rossi has, in the past, established this innovative program, called Partial Italian Art Immersion, with considerable success. It basically means that the students are going to be learning the Italian language and culture through art. A lot of the instructions will increasingly be given in the target language, to maximise the assimilation of the language.

This is an intensive program, which combines instructions, as well as language vocabulary relating to art theory and the topic being covered, such as the Uluru competition, which is the topic for the 2017 Italian WA competition. Through this activity, and others to follow, the students are exposed to the Italian words for different types of lines, warm and cool colours, primary and secondary colours, perspective, horizon, texture, and more.

While all this is taking place, we keep revising and building on our conversational skills and knowledge of grammar, such as feminine and masculine nouns, adjectives and verbs. To enable the students to comprehend these concepts, we revise the English grammar first, as the two go hand in hand, at all times. The cultural aspect of language learning is, of course, embedded into each lesson.


