PROTECTIVE BEHAVIOURS

On **Thursday 2 March** a trained Protective Behaviours WA facilitator, Holly-Ann Martin will be at Liwara to run a staff workshop from 3.30-5.00pm and she will be running a parent workshop on the same evening from 6.00pm-8.00pm. It is extremely important that all parents make a concerted effort to attend this important child protection workshop so that you are informed of the importance of running programs such as this for our students and I know you will leave with a deeper understanding of the program. Please put this date in your diary as it will be an opportune time for any parents who have any questions or concerns about the program to speak directly to Holly-Ann.

Protective Behaviours WA is Western Australia's leading prevention education organisation working in WA and Internationally to prevent child abuse. The Protective Behaviours Program is child-focused, and informed by a fundamental belief that children have a right to physical and psychological safety at all times, and that we as individuals, parents, communities and governments must play a part in protecting children of all ages and walks of life. The programs seek to prevent child abuse by providing greater awareness and understanding; as well as providing the tools and strategies for individuals, organisations, parents, families and communities to address and deal with these issues.

All classes, except the Year Ones will be working with the Protective Behaviours Program this term. The Year One teachers, in collaboration with Jane Evans, our school Social Worker, believe at this age the students benefit from starting the year with the FunFriends Program, which comes under the "Friends for Life" program that is mentioned in the Kidsmatter website:-

In Term Two the students in Year One will be working with the Protective Behaviours Program.

As part of the Strategic Plan 2015-2018 under the area of Learning, one of the Strategic Priorities was to "...Build on the KidsMatter Framework to raise the resilience and well-being of students.." therefore in 2016 & again in 2017, one of our Smart Goals in the Annual School Improvement Plan has been "....to increase and broaden the number of resilience and well being programs offered in the school ..." Working closely with Jane Evans, our Social Worker we are growing these programs and encourage you to talk to your children about the weekly lessons from the Parent Newsletter/Information Sheets that are sent home by the teachers via Skoolbag each week. KidsMatter is a national initiative focusing on children's mental health and wellbeing. The seven guiding principles are:

- 1. The best interests of children are paramount.
- 2. Respectful relationships are foundational
- 3. Diversity is respected and valued.
- 4. Parents and carers are recognised as the most important people in children's lives.
- 5. Parents and teachers support children best by working together.
- 6. Students need to be active participants.
- 7. Schools, health and community agencies work together with families.

SAFETY AROUND SCHOOLS

In an effort to provide a safer environment for everyone City of Joondalup Officers will be conducting patrols of school parking in the mornings and afternoons throughout the school term.

Vehicles which park contrary to parking signage around schools are a major hazard and impact on the safety of children, pedestrians and other road users in these areas. It is imperative that drivers are aware of, and park in accordance with, the parking conditions which apply in near schools.

As part of this initiative Officers will be using patrol vehicles, which have been fitted with Licence Plate Recognition (LPR) cameras, to capture digital images of vehicles which are parked contrary to parking requirements near schools. Any infringement notices, issued as part of these patrols, will be sent via mail to the registered owner of the vehicle.

It would be appreciated if this information could be included in your school newsletters in order to remind parents and caregivers of their responsibility in ensuring that they park correctly near schools.

SOCIAL WORKER'S CORNER

I warmly welcome back families and new families to Liwara as we start another busy and productive year at school.

Briefly in news that will be of interest to parents....

On Thursday 2 March, staff will be involved in another workshop presented by Holly-Ann Martin, Director and Founder of Safe 4 Kids. Teaching and support staff will be having a refresher workshop of Holly-Ann's 10 week Protective Behaviours lesson plan, which they will be able to utilise in each of the learning areas of school environment. The lesson plans have been designed as a preventative measure to combat child abuse by providing children with clear messages regarding inappropriate behaviour. This allows them to identify unsafe situations, recognise their early warning signs, and seek help immediately - and to persist in seeking help until they feel safe again.

A Parent Information Session will be held at Liwara also on Thursday 2nd March, from 6pm to 8pm at which Holly-Ann Martin will present parents with an overview of the concepts of the Protective Behaviours program and talk through current issues parents are faced with. It will be a wonderful opportunity for parents to gain a deeper understanding and appreciation of the program.
