Dear Parents

Come and join with an English class where, to commence the lesson the teacher wrote this sentence on the board and directed the students to correct it: "Woman without her man is nothing." The boys wrote; "Woman, without her man, is nothing." The girls wrote: "Woman! Without her, man is nothing!" Within the context of "Happy Mothers' Day" there surely would be no family member who would disagree with the girls' interpretation.

Of course, the greatest mother of all is Mother Nature and, if you are at all interested in gardening, you would be fully aware of the advice from the gardening gurus that extols the use of slow-release fertilizers. Here's a description of how they work: "Slow-release fertilizers work in conjunction with the processes in the soil. Rather than a quick overdose, these products release nutrients over a period of time, even for several months. This means that the nutrients supply plant roots with a sustainable diet instead of a binge buffet. The plants benefit from a consistent supply of the elements they need throughout their growth." Still within the context of "Happy Mothers' Day". the slow-release nutrients that flow from a mother to her family would be rich in love and care. A consistent supply of love and care, packaged in the Mary, Mother of God, visible form of cooking, cleaning, planting flowers, buying clothes then washing and ironing them, and the less visible form of encouragement, support, compassion, forgiveness, consistency, leads to lives that thrive from the benefit of a consistent supply of the elements they need throughout their growth.

Every mother, at some stage, has been a "helicopter" mother, because like a helicopter, every mother has hovered over her children whether the children needed her or not. Of course, hovering is a maternal instinct and Ann Landers gives a reminder that at some point hovering has to move onto something more developmental: "It's not what you do for your children but what you have taught them to do

for themselves, that will make them successful human beings."

Just as there are slow-release fertilizers for young plants, so too, are there fertilizers for the more mature ones. They might still come in the same shaped tub, but the nutrients have become more suited to the changing needs of the plant. The task of every child is to become independent and the task of all mothers is to help their children reach independence by allowing them to walk-and-fall, to make decisions that might sometimes come undone but in the process, to slowly take control of their lives.

Mothers are persons too, with their own special talents and their own special needs that need constant self-attention, as well as attention from all other family members.

"God gave mothers special gifts,

He made them all unique.

But one thing that all mothers love,

Are kisses on their cheek." Nancy Burr.

A Day in the Life of a Child Less Fortunate

We will be raising money for Child Fund Australia. This organisation provides for children in countries which are less fortunate than us. The money we raise will be helping families with essential items such as clean water, school supplies, food, shelter and warm clothes.

Sustainable Living

Untouched sandwiches, uneaten bananas, unopened muesli bars and full juice boxes, these items are so common in schools' bins that we can guarantee to find them daily. This definitely has shock value but it also highlights how crazy it is to throw away good food. Behaviour changes to combat food waste and prevent sandwiches, fruit and packaged foods from ending up in the bin are a constant challenge that we face.

Some tips that might help address these problems are

*Discuss with your child what they like to eat for lunch and how much. It's not uncommon for lunch boxes to be packed with too much food which ultimately ends up in the bin. Involving

children in making their lunch can result in food choices that are more likely to get eaten.

*Encourage your child to bring home uneaten food rather than disposing of it at school. You can then get a better idea of what is getting eaten and the appropriate quantity of food they need. An added benefit is that children may eat leftovers after school for afternoon tea!





ITALIAN IMMIGRATION TALK BY MRS MARY FARANDA

In week 10 of term 1, both Year 6 classes were very fortunate to have a guest speaker, Mrs Mary Faranda, come to Liwara and give a talk about her family's experience as migrants, from Italy.

"Cultural Understanding" is an integral part of Language Learning, as outlined in the Australian Curriculum, as it enriches the student's cultural knowledge, therefore helping them to embrace other cultures, as well as enhancing their awareness of the difficulties that many migrants had to face, when leaving their homeland, to settle in Australia.

Here are some reflections by the Year 6 students on that presentation:

Meg (6R) - One thing that stood out to me was the message of how lucky we are to have our family around us, because her father had to live over here without his family, for nine years. That must have been very difficult.

Alyssa (6G) - I learnt that many streets in Wanneroo are named after Italian surnames, because they were among the first settlers of that area. It was interesting to listen to someone speak about their family rather than reading information in a book.

Bella (6G) – Her family started growing grapevines in Wanneroo, to then produce wine. When they came to Australia, they were expecting to find more than just a tin shed, as was often the case in those days. The talk taught us to thank the Italian immigrants for coming to Perth to make it what it is today. Grazie mille!
