Dear Families,

It has been wonderful to have the students arrive at school this year in such a calm and settled manner. Thank you to all parents and carers who have played a significant role in allowing this to occur. The staff and I look forward to working alongside you as we journey together in 2018 to engage the students in purposeful learning opportunities. With the full support of our parents, we strive to educate the students in contemporary and collaborative spaces so that they can take risks and develop into confident and faith filled individuals.

All classes, except the Year Ones will be working with the Protective Behaviours Program this term. The Year One teachers, in collaboration with Jane Evans our school Social Worker, believe at this age the students benefit from starting the year with the FunFriends Program, which comes under the "Friends for Life" program that is mentioned in the Kidsmatter website https://www.kidsmatter.edu.au/primary/about-kidsmatter-primary/framework as a recognised program. In Term Two the students in Year One will be working with the Protective Behaviours Program.

A Crime Prevention and Protective Behaviours Puppet Theatre Performance for Pre-School to Year 3 (ages 3-9).

Key Concepts for this performance:

Naming trusted people in the community who can help students stay safe and healthy.

Knowing how to assess a situation and deciding who and when to call for help.

Knowing how to call Triple Zero in an emergency or to contact Police or Crime Stoppers for other issues.

Knowing what to do when finding a discarded needle

Practising ways of asking for help in a range of different situations and scenarios.

Simple actions and decisions students can take to keep themselves and others healthy and safe.

Years 3 and 4 Screen Name An Online Protective Behaviours Performance for Years 4 - 8.

Key Concepts for this performance:

Not everyone we meet online is honest about their true identity

There are safe actions we can take to protect ourselves online

Always tell someone you trust (preferably an adult) if you are concerned about something you experienced online that made you feel unsafe Ensure your personal information is protected online

There are real risks involved in meeting an online contact face to face, as you can never be sure they are who they say they are

Years 5 and 6 Frenemies

Frenemies is an interactive Forum Theatre session for students in Years 4 - 6. It explores bullying and pro-social skills amongst young people.

Key concepts for this performance

• "Bullying is a repeated behaviour; that may be physical, verbal and/or psychological; where there is intent to cause fear, distress, or harm to another; that is conducted by a more powerful individual or group; against a less powerful individual or group of individuals who are unable to stop this from happening." (Olweus 1996)



WRAPPER FREE WEDNESDAYS

'Wrapper Free Days' (lunch and recess) will take place every Wednesday throughout the school year. These days are when students and parents try their best to pack a lunch box without single-use disposable items.

We are aiming to raise awareness of the amount of single-use disposable plastic in our lives and challenges people to do something about it.

Every day we encounter single-use plastic: bags, water bottles, straws, food packaging & takeaway coffee. We can all take steps to avoid plastic becoming a problem and as a school we can choose reusable alternatives and pick up plastic litter.

'Single-use' includes plastic shopping bags, plastic cups, straws, plastic packaging...basically anything that's intended only to be used once and then discarded.

The challenge is quite simple...attempt to refuse single-use plastic. *Please support our school community*

Social Work Corner

FROM THE SOCIAL WORK CORNER – Jane Evans <u>Easy Ways to Build Your Child's Self Esteem with</u> Your Words

The following is taken from *Dr Laura Markham's website*,

<u>www.ahaparenting.com</u> and has lots of great suggestions to build into your

everyday family life.

- 1. Empower your child by seeing her best self. Research shows that kids' beliefs determine their behaviour. When you observe something positive about your child, tell her what you see. "You're working hard on that.... Hey, I saw you got frustrated with your brother, but you were able to stop yourself from yelling....Wow, you read that whole book yourself!....I've noticed that you're remembering to brush your teeth now without being reminded most of the time." Notice that these are specific observations about what your child is actually doing, rather than global pronouncements like "You're smart" which aren't provable, and which kids may argue with in their own minds.
- 2. Empower your child by problem-solving instead of labelling. If you're offering your child guidance about something, stick to what's happening right now and empower your child to solve it. "You always forget to ..." makes him the problem, and programs him to keep forgetting. "How do you think you can help yourself remember tomorrow?" helps him move from being the problem to becoming the problem solver. Just focus on how he can remember this time, and he'll start to see that he's a kid who can support himself to remember, more and more often. Comment especially on any progress in the "right direction," even if it isn't perfect. We all need encouragement to keep plugging away towards a goal.
- 3. Empower your child by helping her keep "failure" in perspective: Kids are creating beliefs about the world from every experience. When things don't work out as they hoped, they often draw global conclusions and "I got all these words wrong" becomes "I'm just no good at spelling....I'm not a good student." Help your child reframe to see that any given setback is temporary and she has some control over whether things will work out next time: "You're really disappointed that you didn't know these words.... What could we do next week so that you know the words before the spelling test?" Give your child as much support as necessary to be successful which is very different than doing it for them. Seeing that their actions have a big impact on their success helps kids try harder next time, instead of giving up on themselves.
- 4. Empower your child by letting him overhear you saying something positive about him to someone else. When you try to convince your child directly, he may resist what you're saying. After all, he sees evidence to the contrary. But when he overhears you saying it to someone else, he begins to believe it might be true. "She was so helpful today.....! think he's finding that focusing on his homework helps him enjoy school more....He and his sister are learning how to work things out....! just so enjoy being with her....

 I am so blessed that I get to be his mother!"


