A MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Families

The season of Lent is upon us again and it is a time for us to focus intentionally on what helps or hinders our commitment to Christ. It may be better not to give up something but to take on something, to build our spiritual muscles. At the beginning of Lent the first thought of many adult Catholics is to give something up and the standard was to give up chocolate of other sweet temptations. A colleague of mine told me that he had urged his children to move beyond giving up sweet treats and to focus on giving up something that made others around them unhappy. About halfway through Lent he asked his children how they were doing with their Lenten promise. One of his young sons had promised to give up fighting with his brother and sister during Lent. When his father asked him how it was going, the boy replied, "I'm doing pretty good, Dad—but boy, I can't wait until Easter!". The response indicates that this boy had only partly understood the purpose of Lenten 'giving up'. Lent is about conversion. It is about working towards changing permanently what we do so that we become better people, not just for the 40 days of Lent but for the rest of our lives.

NEW FAMILY EVENING: Thank you to the dedicated group of P&F members who hosted the New Family Sundowner last week and made such an impact on our new families. In discussion with our new Liwara members, they shared with me how welcome they have felt from the very start and the evening sundowner was just the icing on the cake! Thank you, to all that were there to set up & down and make our new parents feel so welcome. A special thank you to Mrs Gaye Margetic and the OSHC team who ran the creche on the evening as the parents were extremely appreciative of their support.

PASTORAL CARE WORK PARTY SUPPORTING THE MENTAL HEALTH AND WELLBEING OF STUDENTS

As part of our commitment to our students this year, the work party managing the Quality Catholic Schools (QCS) Domain 4: STEWARDSHIP—Pastoral Care of Students, has been diligently working with Jane Evans our Social Worker to create a private/closed 'all staff forum' where teachers can let all staff know at any time of the day if a particular student is having a hard time, is feeling fragile, has family issues that may be affecting their behaviour and/or their emotional state. The child's name and a set list of standard choices will be available to tick so that confidentiality will not be breached at any time. The Pastoral Care of Students team will also be starting a new section in the newsletter each fortnight to keep the community informed of how we as a school are supporting the students with their mental health and wellbeing.

BRING YOUR OWN DEVICE PROGRAM (BYOD)

On behalf of the teachers of our Years 4, 5 & 6 students, I would like to thank our parents for the strong support for the BYOD Program this year, as I have been informed that only one students in each of the Yr 4 & 5 classes have

begun the year without their own device. Some of the benefits of our students

having their own devices below:

Offers Comfort of Using A Known Device. The most important advantage that BYOD offers is surely the comfort of using one's own device as when students bring their own devices to school, they being something familiar with them. This means that they can use it without hassle and are able to focus more easily on the lesson, as they don't have to think about handling completely unknown devices.

Advanced Technology Makes Learning Easier. The advancements in the field of technology have helped to introduce lots of devices. Many of them have features which were hard to imagine even only a few years back. All these are not only making the process of imbibing lessons easier for students, but also helping to retain them longer. And all these can be best utilized if students are able to use their devices properly, so using their own devices surely helps them to learn more effectively.

Ms Leddin and I went down for a final check this morning before the installers come back to clear away the left over debris and we had some fun trying out the many exciting challenges of our new playground which is the culmination of an idea that began with the School Improvement Team (SIT). A group of staff members met in January of 2017 and identified areas which would benefit our students. They needed to be aesthetically pleasing, challenging and adventurous... hence a natural playground on the oval became their priority. The staff worked together and put together a draft plan which was then given to Mr Sean Magorian who used the ideas the staff had come up with and created a plan to scale which was then shown to the P&F who were keen to support the initiative. This has been a huge community effort from the idea driven by a need in early 2017 to where we are today. I am hoping to have it handed over to me early next week. Once the temporary fencing is down, parents please go down for a look and a play. You will note that we have positioned the black fencing down to freeway fence, so the children now have an option to use some of the extra space that runs along the oval. TEASING VERSUS BULLYING

When speaking with parents when I present at schools, or engaging with them via our social media, bullying is always a hot topic. A recent Facebook post had one of our biggest engagement rates ever. It begged the question- "What is bullying? Do we mix it up with teasing and other forms of mean behaviour?" Bullying is a term that's wrapped in emotion. For many people it's associated with bad childhood memories. It's been estimated that around 40 per cent of people have experienced bullying in the past. It's something that we don't want to happen to our kids. But I fear it's being overused at the moment and confused with teasing and rudeness.

Rudeness refers to thoughtless behaviours and thoughtless words. Kids often do rude things to each other without thinking their actions through. Examples include breaking wind in a child's direction; joking about the colour of a child's hair in front of others; failing to share possessions and neglecting to acknowledge someone. Rudeness is usually about selfishness and thoughtlessness. Taken on their own, many rude behaviours can be seen as an element of bullying but when looked at in context they are more about thoughtlessness, lack of consideration and poor manners rather than a deliberate attempt to hurt someone.

Teasing refers to annoying, hurtful behaviour that is used to get a reaction from someone else. Teasing can be persistent in nature, but not always. It's generally an attempt to get under a person's skin. It can involve name calling; it can be personal and hurtful in nature. It can also infringe on another person's rights. But generally teasing doesn't have the key ingredients that make up bullying.

Bullying is the selective, uninvited, repetitive oppression of one person or group by another. It involves three elements – intent to hurt or harm; power imbalance; and repetition over time. It takes many forms and guises including physical aggression; verbal abuse; emotional aggression (or blackmail); intimidation; harassment and exclusion.

The new cyber-dimension to bullying has moved the goalpost for many kids. In the past, children and young people could escape bullying behaviours by being at home. Cyber-bullying means that children can't escape bullies like they once could.

Our ability to be discerning about bullying is as important as the action we take when we are sure that our child is on the receiving end of bullying behaviour. These actions include: dealing with feelings; providing emotional coping skills; getting others involved; building up a child's support networks; and building self-confidence that can take a battering.

Special/Sports Group Photos

If your child is in a Special/Sports photo you will receive a link and password to the online gallery after photo day, where you can view and order these photos if required. These photos will be packed and delivered with the school's bulk order.

SACRAMENT ENROLMENT MASSES

Any Liwara child intending to make their First Reconciliation (Yr 3), First Holy Communion (Yr 4) or Confirmation (Yr 6) this year is expected to attend an All Saints Parish Mass, at either 6pm Saturday 24th February or on Sunday 25th February at 7.30am, 9.30am or 5.30pm, and sign the enrolment register.

PARENT SACRAMENT THEOLOGY EVENING

A reminder that the All Saints Parish & Liwara CPS Sacramental Team are running a 'Theology of Sacraments' presentation for any interested parents. This is recommended for any Year 3, 4 or 6 parents whose child/ren are receiving any one of the three Sacraments this year (i.e. Reconciliation, Eucharist or Confirmation). The presentation by Karl Brown will take place on **Tuesday 27 February** in the Ahern Centre commencing at 7pm.

RECONCILIATION COMMITMENT MASSES

Any child who is receiving the Sacrament of First Reconciliation this year (i.e. most Year 3 students) is expected to attend an All Saints Parish Mass, at either 6pm Saturday 10th March or on Sunday 11th March at 7.30am, 9.30am or 5.30pm to express their commitment to the required preparation.


