

PRE-KINDERGARTEN PROGRAM

The Liwara Catholic Primary School Pre-Kindergarten Program is your child's first introduction to school. It is an early childhood play based learning program for children who have turned three years of age. The program provides a learning environment that promotes the development of social, emotional, spiritual, language, creative and physical skills.

This booklet includes all the relevant information required for a successful and smooth start to your child's Pre-Kindergarten year and will set the foundations for future school learning experiences.

We provide a full day program that runs on a Wednesday and / or Friday from 8.45am - 2.45pm. Our Pre-Kindergarten fee is \$75.00 per day.



MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL



When your child attends our Pre-Kindergarten Program, we encourage parents to stay and help their child become familiar with the environment and participate in the experiences provided in the classroom. We ask that at each session you spend some time reading a story or engaging in play with your child. Once they are comfortable, say goodbye and leave.

OUR PROGRAM

The following documentation is used to guide our planning and assessment of play and learning experiences:

National Quality Framework (NQF)

The NQF is a national legislative framework under which Early Childhood and Care Services operate in Australia.

The NQF encompasses the Education and Care Services National Regulations, under which the program operates. The National Regulations can be downloaded from: www.acecqa.com.au – The Early Years Learning Framework (EYLF).

Our teaching practices are guided by the Early Years Learning Framework (EYLF), and National Early Childhood Curriculum. The curriculum is based on three key statements:

- **Belonging:** Children being connected to family, culture, and place.
- **Being:** Children need opportunities to seek and make meaning of their world.
- **Becoming:** Identifies children's knowledge, understanding, skills, capacities, and relationships.

The EYLF emphasises the benefits of children learning through 'doing' or through play.

Children learn best through play because:

- > It is a natural and spontaneous activity for a child.
- ➤ It allows for children's differences and encourages an individual approach.
- ➤ It encourages children to learn through trial and error and experimentation.
- ➤ It gives teachers the chance to observe individual progress in an informal learning environment.

OUR PRE-KINDERGARTEN DAY

It is very important that each child feels happy and comfortable in our Pre-Kindergarten environment. Staff will contact you if any issues arise that they are unable to resolve.

Starting Our Day

On arrival, please assist your child with putting their drink bottle on the trolley and placing their bag in allocated cubby holes.

Next, help your child choose an activity and spend some quality time playing together. This will help your child feel calm & settled in their environment. When it is time to say goodbye give your child a reassuring hug and a kiss and bring them to the mat area. Please notify staff if you have any concerns that may impact on your child's day.

Experiences Throughout the Day

Children will participate in planned, guided experiences that are often non-product based. These activities are important for the foundation and growth of social and emotional development, language and literacy, numeracy, science, art, and creativity as well as fine and gross motor skills.

Children work individually and alongside their peers to discover, explore, experiment, and create with a variety of sensory textures, toys, games, and puzzles. They are encouraged to use their oral language skills to describe and explain their thinking as well as ask and answer questions. The dramatic play centre allows children to use their imagination to learn to express themselves, share their thoughts and ideas and learn about the world around them.

Gross motor skills are developed by providing children with opportunities to engage in a variety of movements on the playground equipment such as climbing, balancing, spinning, and sliding. Specific skills such as running, cycling, throwing, bouncing, and catching will also be taught. At times messy sensory tubs or water play will be offered.

In the afternoon, all children are encouraged to have a rest and engage in mindfulness exercises such as learning breathing techniques and simple meditation. Children also participate in dancing, singing, circle games, story time and playing musical instruments.

Pick-up Routine

Children stay inside the classroom until a parent or guardian arrives to collect them.



WHAT TO BRING TO PRE-KINDERGARTEN

Please clearly label everything with your child's name

Requirements for each session:

- A *bag* to carry their belongings, a large waterproof shopping/beach bag is ideal. Open top is preferred.
- Three sets of underwear.
- *Two* pairs of socks.
- A *change of clothes* that is seasonally appropriate.
- A cardigan or jacket in cooler weather.
- A wide brimmed sun hat.
- A water bottle that will be refilled throughout the day.
- An *insulated lunch box* with cooler blocks.
- A *separate container for morning tea and lunch is preferred*. Please consider healthy food choices such as fresh fruit and vegetables, sandwiches, wraps, crackers, yoghurt and cheese.

We would appreciate your support in leaving packaged treat foods for home use. When children bring biscuits, chips, lollies, or chocolate we will send them home as this age group finds it particularly confusing and upsetting that we are unable to share. We are a 'Nut Aware School', respecting the rights of others to be safe from harm, so please check packaging carefully.

APPROPRIATE CLOTHING AND SHOES

The children need to be wearing clothing that allow them to independently access the toilet, which are sun safe and appropriate for climbing, crawling, balancing, and running.

Shoes such as sneakers or sandals with Velcro straps are ideal.

Please apply <u>sunscreen</u> before school and we will apply more during the day.



WHAT TO EXPECT IN THE FIRST FEW WEEKS

The first term in Pre-Kindergarten is an important time for each child. For some, it will be their first experience away from home and their immediate family.

It is a time when they:

- Venture into a new environment.
- Meet and learn to trust new people.
- Interact and share with other children.
- Work in a group situation.

Our primary goal is to ensure that Pre-Kindergarten is a welcoming, safe, and happy environment where your child has the opportunity to:

- Develop a strong sense of identity.
- Connect and contribute to their world.
- Develop a strong sense of wellbeing.
- Grow in confidence.

You can support your child by:

- Showing an interest in what your child does at Pre-Kindergarten.
- Talking about the positive experiences they have at Pre-Kindergarten.
- Praising their efforts and positive behaviour.
- Sharing relevant information to assist us in getting to know your child.

HEALTH AND WELLBEING

Please inform us of any condition that may affect your child's wellbeing and equally of any circumstances that may affect their behaviour on a particular day.

If your child is sick, please ensure that they remain at home until fully recovered. Please contact the office if your child will be absent. If your child has a green discharge from their nose, vomits or has diarrhoea we expect that they will not attend the program until they are well and stay home for a 24-48 hour period. If your child requires medication during school hours, please contact the office to discuss what is required.

DROP OFF & PICK UP

If your child is being collected by someone else, can you please record this information in our communication book. Children must be delivered to the classroom by an adult and will only be released to a known adult.

GUIDING BEHAVIOUR

The role of the teachers is to encourage positive behaviour and interactions and boundaries will be enforced consistently and fairly. We will respect and comfort a child regardless of the behaviour. Children will be given verbal reminders of appropriate behaviours and if necessary, be given assistance to appropriately assert themselves with others.

Children at this age are developing social and interpersonal skills that involve the consideration of others. It is expected that this process is best developed with support, consistency, modelling, and guidance. We will consistently respect the individual developmental stage of every child when guiding or redirecting behaviour.

PARENT MEETINGS

We act with respect by working cooperatively, being accepting and considering others and the environment.




MERCY
