COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS – SCHOOL CONTINUATION ARRANGEMENTS



SCHOOLS IN PERTH AND PEEL REGION



Monday 3 May 2021 2.15pm

As you may be aware, at his press conference this morning Premier Mark McGowan advised that there had been no new cases of community transmission of COVID-19 in Perth overnight. However there have been many new exposure sites added to the list (see link below).

ARRANGEMENTS FOR PERTH AND PEEL REGION SCHOOLS EFFECTIVE 3 MAY 2021

If a secondary student has visited Perth/Peel and attends school in another region (e.g. Albany) he/she is required to wear a mask at school for a period of 14 days commencing from the date he/she left Perth/Peel or until the face mask wearing direction is revoked by the Police Commissioner. The usual face mask wearing exemptions apply.

PUBLIC EXPOSURE SITES

Unless you are advised by WA Health that you are a close contact who needs to self-quarantine for a full 14 days, if you have been at any of the locations listed on the Department of Health website HealthyWA at the times specified, you need to attend a **COVID clinic** for testing and isolate at home until you receive a negative result.

If a person receives a negative COVID-19 result but then subsequently (soon after) develops symptoms, they should present for testing again and isolate at home until they receive a negative result.

COVID-19 VACCINE

From today, Monday 3 May, the vaccine will be available for people who are aged 50 and over. Healthy WA has information and frequently asked questions for the Western Australian community about the COVID-19 vaccination rollout. You can also contact the Coronavirus Information Helpline on 13 268 43 for further information.

Many of these exposure sites are within our locality, however, the risks have been deemed to be low.

Arrangements for the week ahead

- The Certificate Assembly that was postponed on Friday 30 April and re-scheduled for this Friday, 7 May, will continue as planned unless there is a change in the COVID-19 restrictions by the Premier. As the Year 6 students will be on camp they will receive their certificates at the Certificate Assembly on Fri 21 May.
- Unfortunately, our Mother's Day Breakfast which was scheduled for **Tuesday 11 May** will be <u>cancelled</u> due to the uncertainty surrounding the current COVID-19 situation in Perth.
