VISUAL ARTS

Our planning and learning in Visual Arts comes directly from the Western Australian Curriculum.

Lessons include Visual Art elements such as line, texture and value, as well as various artists and art movements.

Respectful cross-curricular links are made with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander histories and cultures, past and present. Particular histories and traditions of Asian cultures are also studied. Through making and responding in the Visual Arts, Liwara Catholic Primary School students consider the issues of sustainability in relation to resource use. Information technology is an integral part in the facilitation of our students' learning.





The Social Justice Ministry organized a 'Walk for Water' to make the students aware of the people who have to walk many kilometers to get water for survival. The students carried a bucket or water bottle around a marked path. They began on the oval, where we spoke with children about the challenges some people face to get clean water, we then walked through the undercover area, past the Ahern Center, around the top of the school and then past the year six courtyard and down the ramps back to the oval. At the end of the two laps around the school, we gathered on the oval, where we gave out mini quote cards that will remind students that water is precious. We did not waste our water in the buckets, many gardens around the school were watered.

The day was a success and we were all tired at the end. We were so happy that everything went as we planned. Thanks everyone for participating in the 'Walk for Water'.
