

CERTIFICATE ASSEMBLY


Today there will be a Certificate Assembly 9th August commencing at 2.30pm in the Ahern Centre. All are welcome to attend.

sustainable Living



What an exciting week! The new Year 6 Green Team has been formed and we welcome the new Environment Ministry – Molly W, Xavier, Thomas, Jett and Jayda and the new Garden Gurus – Jake and Cody to our school's sustainability program for second semester. We have lots of exciting plans for Terms 3 and 4 in sustainability including worm farming, mulching, growing seasonal plants and more. We are very excited to introduce our newest Liwara sustainability initiative with the company Greenbatch. We are now recycling type 1 and type 2 plastics, as well as aluminium cans, at Liwara in our new purple and green recycling bins pictured on the left. The bins are located on the path outside the Visual



Arts Centre and in the Undercover Area. Students can drop their bottles and cans into these bins on the way to their classes each morning.



Type 1 PET (polyethylene) Plastics include transparent plastic containers such as cool drink and juice bottles as well dressing and water bottles, pictured below. Please encourage students to rinse these containers and then remove the lids. Lids are usually made from Type 5 plastic that Greenbatch won't recycle but, they may be placed the in your yellow lid household recycling bins. Bottle caps are recycled elsewhere in Australia.



Type 2 HDPE (High Density Polyethylene) plastic containers, pictured below, may be coloured or translucent and include milk containers, some juice containers and other plastic containers that are used in the bathroom and laundry such as shampoo containers, health food and medicine bottles and spray bottles. Again, Type 2 containers also need to be washed and brought to the purple Greenbatch recycling bins at school minus their lids, unless the lids are made from Type 2 HDPE.

We encourage Liwara students to begin bringing in their rinsed plastic bottles (minus their lids) made from Type 1 PET and Type 2 HDPE. Once bins are filled, we will contact Greenbatch to collect our bags and in the future as this initiative becomes self-sufficient, Liwara will have the opportunity to collect 3D printing ribbon that is made from recycled bottle plastic. We thank our generous P&F for their support of this new recycling initiative at Liwara and hope our school soon sees the benefits from supporting Greenbatch.


