Last week, three of our staff members attended the 'Making Wellbeing Visible in Schools' professional development at the Newman Sienna Centre in Doubleview. The seminar was designed by award winning and internationally acclaimed psychology researcher, Professor Lea Waters (PhD). Visible Wellbeing (VWB) combines the science of wellbeing with the science of learning to achieve the three key goals of:

- helping students and staff to more clearly see their own and other's wellbeing using VWB practices
- helping students and staff more systematically *build* wellbeing
- facilitating learning through the visible wellbeing classroom process

It was affirming to note that quite a few of the many strategies that Professor Waters shared were things that the teachers at Liwara have been doing already. The team that went to the seminar will be working with the staff to grow VWB in our school. We are blessed to have a school culture that nurtures and embraces the wellbeing of students, staff and the wider community so becoming a 'Visible Wellbeing School' will be an extension on what we already do by expanding our knowledge to increase the emotional, physical and mental wellbeing of our students.

Everyone enjoyed the participation against other schools and competed with great determination. Although there were outstanding individual performances, this was a 'no-points' event so, there are no results to report.



Gymnastics Program

This week, the PrePrimary, Year 2 and Year 4 students began a 4-week Gymnastics program run during Phys. Ed. classes by instructors from the Northern District Gymnastics Club.



Congratulations

A hearty congratulations to Oliver Clarke in Year 5 who competed as a Liwara student at the 2019 inaugural Primary Champion Schools track and field carnival where he received a silver medal for long jump with a distance of 4.37 m and a gold medal (and current record holder) for turbo javelin with a distance of 27.15 m.









Wow! We have had another great week in Sustainability at Liwara. The Green Team have been putting sustainability into action. They have planted tomato seedlings in old recycled lift top desks. We used two tubs per planter, the upper with drainage holes added and the bottom tray to collect water run-off. We collected soil that has been mixed by Mr Ridout with mulch, dampened it down, then added our tomato seedlings grown in the school greenhouses, before mulching on top to prevent water loss.



With regular watering, we should soon have a good supply of cherry and tree tomatoes that we can give to the school canteen. We are also growing strawberries and have set up two planter boxes with basil that we have reared in the greenhouses.







As you can see our first Greenbatch collection has taken place! We look forward to there being many more! Keep recycling Liwara because together we make our planet a cleaner place for everyone!





In Kindy we have been learning about "Creepy Crawlies". God created so many different types of creatures and these are the very small ones that we often don't notice. We have learnt about insects and how they have 6 legs and three body parts. The students have investigated slaters, ants and even a giant sandgroper that was found in the playground under a big rock. We have silkworms and they are currently eating their way through lots of mulberry leaves so that they can spin a cocoon in preparation for the next stage of their lifecycle.

In Kindy Red, we have Mrs Edis on her teaching practicum, and she read a fun book about ladybirds. This led to us making ladybird puppets, cutting our own ladybirds and using dice to count and work out how many dots each ladybird should have. Our playdough table has lots of craft items so that we could create our own creatures. Have a look at some of the things we have made so far.

In Kindy Green we integrated our sound work to learn about Creepy Crawlies. We wrapped wool around pop-sticks to create spider webs and made spiders from air dry clay. As part of our work on the 'a' sound we made a sandy ant hill and covered it in aluminium foil ants. We have hidden some creepy crawlies in our sensory tub and have lots of fun finding them each day.
